

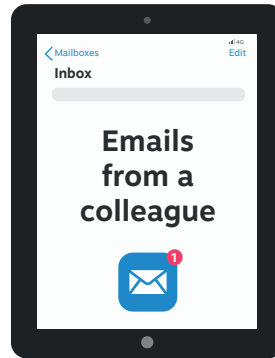
## How to Spot Office365 Phishing Emails

We're seeing a rise in the number of phishing emails entering inboxes, especially those enticing users to enter their Office365 credentials for the latest information, cure or tax refunds. Here's what you need to look out for...



**The process for logging into Office365 doesn't change.**

You should see the message - Taking you to your organisation's login page - after which you are prompted for your email and password.

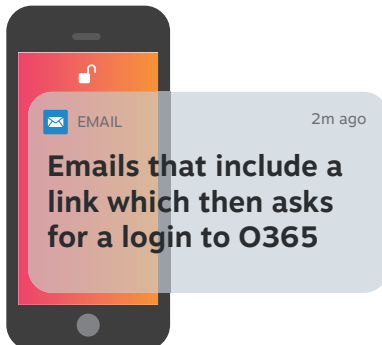


**Cyber criminals posing as your colleagues may ask you to validate that they are logging on to the right page.**



**It should be the same as your organisation's domain.**

Look out for slight modifications such as Node4co.uk instead of Node4.co.uk.



**In order to read the email in first instance, you're already logged in and therefore will not be asked again.**

### What to do if you suspect a breach

- Contact your IT team
- Check your inbox rules to see if they have been tampered with
- Check sent items for emails which you did not send
